
WELCOME

ABOUT THE PAST

We are the results of a segregated school system which housed its black high school in a building on the corner of 12th and Polk Streets in Lynchburg, Virginia, named Dunbar High School. Its doors were opened in 1923; three members of its initial faculty who also taught us, Mrs. Amy P. Jordon, Miss Dorothy Lomax, and Mr. Norvell O. White, were invited to share in our reunion.

Twenty-one years after this beginning (1944), Dunbar High School graduated 60 students, according to the Commencement program. The newspaper reported 70 graduates of the "Dunbar Negro High School." Four more of us were graduated during the summer, and six young men who were in the armed services were listed on our class night program.

The valedictorian was Willis Lee Davis; the salutatorian, Marion Lorraine White.

Colors were blue and white; flower was a red rose. (Well, we were in World War II.)

We were fortunate to share Mr. Clarence W. Seay as our principal. He remained in this position until his retirement in 1968. He then served as City Councilman and Vice Mayor. He died in 1982.

Our first reunion, the 20th, was held June 6-9, 1964 with fun at Ford Acres and attendance at graduation exercises.

The big integration (?) took place in 1970. For one year, Dunbar housed 9th and 10th grade students who were sent to E. C. Glass for their junior and senior years. The Dunbar complex was now 5 buildings. Black teachers were transferred to other schools so that there would be a "proper" quota in each school and so that the Black power structure would deteriorate.

The building that we knew as Dunbar High School was demolished on July 2, 1979.

The motto of this great school, however, is "Looking forward not backward." So let's move on.

*After our building was torn down, a committee was appointed by the Lynchburg School Board to prepare a memorial to honor the outstanding contributions of Dunbar High School. Two members of the Class of 1944, Carolyn Brown and Elaine Chafin Watson, were members of this committee. The physical memorial now stands where our building stood, and we will take our picture there. It was designed by a Dunbar alumnus, Gerald Butler. Members of the committee thought that we needed more than a physical memorial, but the School Board would only fund the physical one. The Virginia Foundation for the Humanities funded a study of "the effects of integration on black high schools in the south;" thus, the slide-tape presentation called "The Dunbar Story."
